Drop off Behavior

Robert arrived first, waited upstairs. He brought the picture of Stephanie on the riding mower that she spoke of last visit; asked if she could have it. I told him that anything that represented the past should go through the attorneys and he said ok. Stephanie and Lou Ann walked down the street; I asked where they had parked and said it was ok to park in front of the church in the evenings. Stephanie "No, THEY don't get along" and made her fingers criss cross to indicate to me who she meant. (mom and dad) Lou Ann mouthed to me that those were "his words exactly to Stephanie". Stephanie requested the elevator again and we went upstairs. Lou Ann brought a book to read while waiting.

Describe visit: When we got into the room, Stephanie told me she'd brought a letter for Rachel and asked if she could send it home with dad. I asked if I could read it first and she said, "ok, but silently". There was a photo of Stephanie folded up inside the index card the note was written on. It stated that she missed her and hoped that the whole family would be together again someday. I told her she could give the note to dad to give to Rachel and he put it in his pocket. Stephanie and Robert chatted at the table for awhile; Stephanie told of spraining her ankle and getting stung by a bee. Robert asked her if she'd like to play a game; she looked in the cupboard and said she was really in the mood to play Mario and "beat the giant bullet world" that she'd tried to beat last time. Robert said that was fine, told her he'd watch "the expert" play the game. They discussed the game as she played. She was very animated trying to move the controller by moving her body as well. She explained all her plays to dad and he commented on her wins and sympathized with her losses. After a time, she said she was tired of Mario (she beat the giant bullet world but got stuck in another one) and put in another game to try. The game didn't work at first; she blew into game (to blow away dust) and the game worked. She raised her fist as if in victory and Robert told her "Good job". I gave the 5 minute call to the end of visit. Stephanie's eyes got big and she said, "Only 5?"

Describe interaction: They sat talking of general things at the beginning of visit, then Robert watched Stephanie play Nintendo. Conversation was continuous (mostly of game plays) throughout visit: laughter during parts of the game.

Main activities: Nintendo

Pick up Behavior

Stephanie asked her dad if he brought her any money. He said no. The corners of her mouth turned down and she looked away. I explained it was a rule for the program--no gifts or money except special occasions--and she said "no fair". Robert stood up and they gave each other a hug. Robert said, "I love you"; Stephanie nodded head yes and said, "Um hum". She reminded him to give the note to Rachel. We scheduled next visit and I took Stephanie down to her mom, gave visit card. Date needed to be changed; we did so; Lou Ann and Stephanie said they'd see me next time. Upstairs Robert stated he thought a meeting was to be held after 2 visits. I stated that I was unaware of anything like that and was scheduling weekly as per Court Order. He agreed visits should continue so as to not break contact and will speak with his attorney about any meeting/discussion that he thought was to be held. He thanked me and let.
